
USGBC Cincinnati to host tours of Herald Building, DeSales Flats



The U.S. Green Building Council Cincinnati Regional Chapter will hold a free tour of the LEED Gold Cincinnati Herald Building this Thursday from 5:30 p.m.-6:30 p.m.

The three-story, 46,000-square-foot building at [3440 Burnet Avenue](#) in Avondale was designed by [DNK Architects, Inc.](#) and serves as the headquarters of the *Cincinnati Herald*. The building also houses offices for [Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center](#) and street-level retail space.

In addition to earning LEED Gold certification last year, the structure was selected as a Green Building of America Award-winning project and was featured in the *Real Estate & Construction Review Midwest* "Green Success Stories" edition.

Designer Raffi Tomassian of DNK Architects, Thomas Stinger of developer [Al. Neyer, Inc.](#), and Franz Stansbury of the Uptown Consortium and Burnet Avenue Association will be on hand to answer questions.
